

### **St GEORGE – MYTH OR GOOD GUY?**

St George has had over the years a fluctuating reputation. Adopted as the patron saint not only in England but in several other places too, reaching a peak in the Middle Ages. It plummeted in the latter part of the last century, but of late George has been rehabilitated.

In truth very little is known about him, but his existence is now generally accepted. His reputation suffered because of the episode of the dragon, and of confusion with another of the same name who, although a saint has a less than saintly history.

It is likely that he hailed from Lydda, in Palestine. A convert to Christianity, he was indeed a soldier, when, in the days of Roman Emperors Diocletian and Maximian emperor worship was decreed. His declining to do this cost him his job, and ultimately his life.

Richard the Lion Heart placed his Crusading army under George's protection and the simple red cross upon their tunics. It was an easy move from there to the flag. The apogee was no doubt reached when Edward III, under his patronage founded the Order of the Garter.

Stripping away the myth we find a good soldier and an even more faithful Christian. A man who placed his duty to his God above his duty to his emperor.
